## EAST COAST



### ORFORD, TRIABUNNA AND MARIA ISLAND



Heading up the east coast from Hobart, the first towns you roll into are Orford and Triabunna – unpretentious, family-friendly hubs with good beaches and some impressive spots to eat and drink. Oh wait... What's that huge island over there? Maria Island National Park serves up a unique mix of heritage and history, camping, walking, mountain biking and wildlife.


- ⊕ Expect the full resort treatment pools, gym, dining and more at Orford's Eastcoaster Tasmania


- Cruise from Triabunna to Maria Island and take a good look around with <u>Maria Island Cruises</u>



- → Paddle a sea kayak around the national park on a guided tour with Freycinet Adventures




COME DOWN FOR AIR

# ST HELENS AND BAY OF FIRES



Little St Helens is about as urban as the east coast gets — a buzzy, suntrap fishing town with beachy vibes. Mountain biking is big business here, while a short drive away is picture–perfect Binalong Bay, the jewel of the lichen–flecked Bay of Fires. Detour inland a little way and you're in Pyengana country, home to lush pastures, waterfalls and artisan cheese from contented cows.

- Sip some handcrafted wines in an atmospheric 1900s shearing shed at St Helens'
   Priory Ridge Wines
- Swirl some Japanese influences around healthy modern Australian food at **Raida St Helens**

#### **DRIVING TIPS**

Remember that Tasmania might look little on the map, but getting from A to B here can take longer than you think.


Drive to the conditions – take it easy in bad weather and on winding, gravelly or icy roads – and give yourself plenty of time.

Slow down and keep an eye out for wildlife on the road, especially at dawn and dusk – or better yet, avoid driving at night.
